Over the past year, the Development Team has had the opportunity to meet and share stories with alumni and friends in Denver, Los Angeles, Italy and many other cities and countries around the world. We have been welcomed into your homes and your communities and want to thank you for believing in and supporting the mission of Up with People.

We are excited for the enthusiasm that alumni have for this organization and the optimism shared for its success. However, our passion and enthusiasm alone won't get us into the future. We must rely upon financial support from those who know, love, and believe in what we are doing.

As you may know, in July 2006, Up with People ended the fiscal year with a positive net income for the first time in 13 years and we are committed to ensuring its existence for generations to come! Student Spotlight



Jiayi (Simi) Liang joins Up with People Cast A 2007 from China. Since joining the program in January, Simi has enjoyed getting to know her host families in Denver, Farmington, Tucson, and Dallas. She says, I have an urge to wake up every morning to see what the day will bring, especially what cultural experiences I will have in my host family. In Tucson, Arizona I went on a cactus tour and had cactus candy."

1) What are some of the local needs you have learned about in the cities you have visited so far?

Jiayi (Simi) Liang

For the past several months, I have had the chance to get to know the communities in each city we have visited. Some of the local community concerns include homelessness, education, and the health care system for poor people.

The experience we had at the Navajo Native American Reservation in Farmington, New Mexico made me realize that the children there are still living in a relatively "closed environment" and are very shy toward the outside world. I am glad we were able to take the initiative to engage with them and try to understand their culture. I hope that we were able to spread a message about the world to the rest of the community

2) What is being done to address some of these needs?

During each community service project, we do various activities such as painting shelters for homeless people, packaging food for a food bank and reading stories for children. But I am amazed by what we have accomplished as a group: in 2 days, we had a homeless shelter looking as if it were brand new with painting and refurbishing. In Tucson, we went to local elementary school and high school and directly impacted 800-1000 students. We dedicated our time, passion and culture to these projects, which in my opinion, makes a big difference.

3) Do these local needs have any relevance or importance on an international level?

I believe so. Every community faces the problem of increasing gap between rich and poor, every community faces social issues, and by working with social issues in another countries, we are better able to identify problems and solutions in our own home communities. By experiencing different social issues around the world during our travels, cast members can form a better sense of global understanding--thinking globally, taking a stand and being ready for action.

4) Has your experience working on the Community Impact projects so far brought up any questions or new areas of interest for you? If so, what?


Of course. Working with my friends from the cast to improve other people's lives has turned out to be such a rewarding thing to do. I feel that even a student like me that does not have money can still make this world a little better by putting my heart and efforts in it.

The other thought about community service

This motivates me a lot and encourages me to stand in other people's shoes and speak what is on my heart. Keeping that in mind, I am enjoying my Up with People journey very much.
