## A VIEW FROM THE STAGE AT WORLD YOUTH DAY

A UWP alumnus recalls performing for thousands on a summer day in 1993.

During the summer of 1993, Eduardo Aguirre ('84E) was an Assistant Cast Manager for UWP and learned that Cast 1993 C would be performing for Pope John Paul II in Denver for World Youth Day along with two other casts, alumni and staff. The three summer casts were in the middle of staging and orientation when this event occurred, so all the stops were pulled out to provide a quality, professional performance at Mile High Stadium.

Pope John Paul II left a legacy for youth in his institution of World Youth Day in 1986 in Rome,

which has continued, carrying on the hope for the youth of the world and inviting them to participate. There have been 12 International World Youth Day celebrations where young people continue to answer the invitation of the Pope in staggering numbers. While these events are organized by the clergy of the Catholic Church, youth of all faiths are invited to attend, making this gathering truly global.

Eduardo's recollection of the event was one of excitement and reverence. The cast was able to rehearse on the stage just prior to World Youth Day and performed a lineup that included the songs "What Color is God's Skin?",

"Up with People," an international medley, and "Room for Everyone." In fact, "Room for Everyone" had to be extended and repeated because the Pope's helicopter was late. The cast kept singing the song over and over. Eduardo noted, "It was just crazy, performing in front of 60,000 people, and it was one of the highlights of our year before we even hit the road! I will remember this forever."

Video clips and photos of this 1993 international experience were displayed in the "Journey" room at the recent Celebrate 50! Reunion in Orlando. Many attendees recalled the event, and emailed or texted Eduardo photos of him performing at World Youth Day. Eduardo commented "...to experience this historic fifty-year reunion and hear from friends who saw photos of me in the 1993 display was really special."

Another Pope will be entertained by UWP this year. Cast B 2015's world tour will end in Rome this semester. During their week in

Rome the cast will perform for Pope Francis during his weekly address in St. Peter's Square. Pope Francis has also announced a Jubilee Year of Mercy which begins on December 8, 2015. Pope Francis will be celebrating this day by going to the Piazza Mignanelli and the Piazza di Spagna (the Spanish Steps). He will lay a wreath at the Colonna dell'Immacolata on the Spanish Steps and will also give his annual message there. This event is being hosted by the Mayor of Rome. UWP's Cast B 2015 has been invited to perform at this auspicious event.
